"National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission (NCDRC) Jurisdiction explained"



As per Section 35(1) read with Section 2(5) of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019, a consumer complaint can be filed by the following:

- 1. As an <u>Individual</u> consumer who has paid more than Rs. 2 Crores; Sec. 35(1)(a)
- 2. Two or more consumers <u>Jointly</u>, if the collective amount paid by the consumers is more than 2 Crores; Sec. 35(1)(a) (No class action required)
- 3. Jointly with other similar consumers through a <u>Voluntary Consumer</u>

 <u>Association</u>, if the collective amount paid by the consumers is more than 2

 Crores; Sec. 35(1)(b)
- 4. As a group of consumers under the <u>Class Action</u>, if the collective amount paid by the consumers is more than 2 Crores. Sec. 35(1)(c)

Note: From 30th December 2020, Original/Pecuniary Jurisdiction of the National Commission has been reduced to Rs. 2 crores paid amount, which earlier was Rs. 10 Crores.
